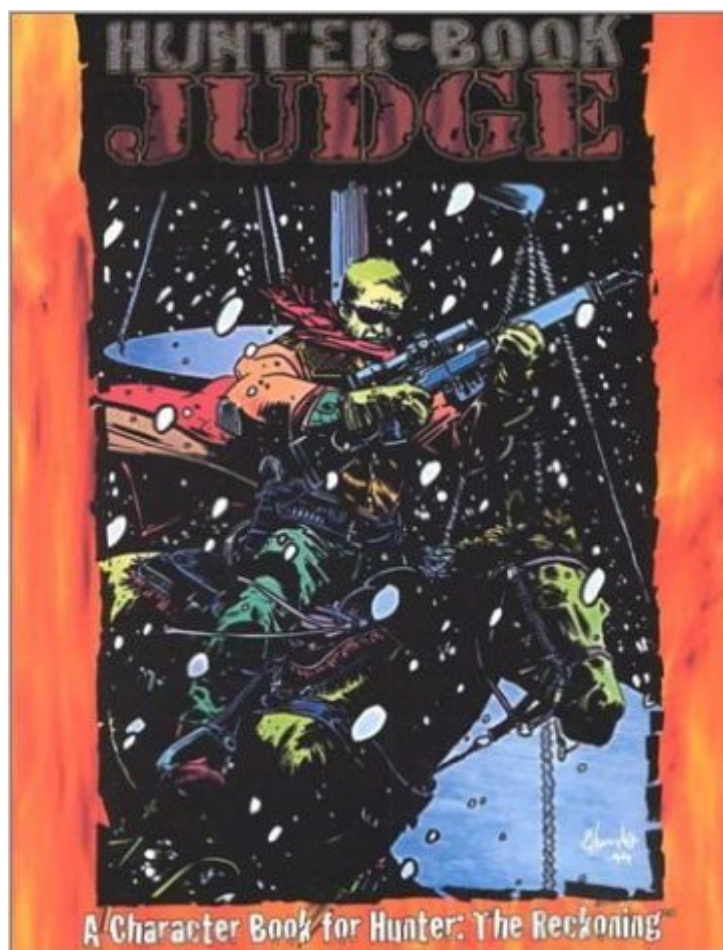

The new backgrounds, abilities and edges are a welcome complement to any judge whether they be an underground guerilla to a judicator of ideals.

This book expands on the background of Judges. Does it pretty well to. Although I think they can get a little preachy at times, it helps if your player can have a better background as this book

provides.

If you are looking for new ideas and skills then just go toward chapter five because there is a wealth of information. But if you are planning to get new insights or a basic storyline from it then it's very incoherent.
