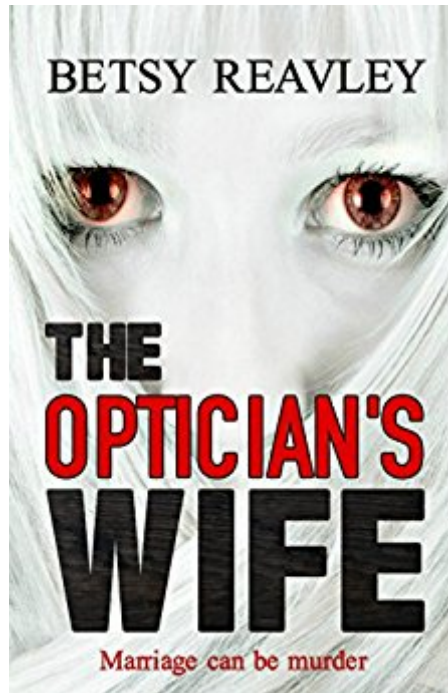


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The Optician's Wife: A Compelling New Psychological Thriller

Weirdest book ever which I don't know is a good thing. This book left me feeling dirty. I was so tired of hearing about how the wife was always stinking, not changing her underwear. If the author was going for her readers to feel disgusted, she sure accomplished that. I also knew what the supposed "twist" was about halfway through the book so it was no surprise to me. The book gets 3 stars because it was a fast, steady read but the twists were predictable (how many villains can there be?) and the characters too one dimensional and unlikable.

Yes, it is a dark book. Yes, it is somewhat predictable in the way that you will probably guess the twist. That said, it is fast paced and the ending literally had my stomach clenched, my body tensed, and I think I was even holding my breath and shaking my head in denial of what happened. This is a disturbing book in a lot of ways, but to me thrillers are supposed to be disturbing. If you like reading scary books that pull you in, I would recommend.

I was given an ARC by the author in exchange for an honest review. The book much more complex and layered than it first appears. Dee is one of the most complex fictional characters I've ever read. She's a very sympathetic character at first; sad, frumpy, shy and a bit put upon – the kind of person you instinctively feel sorry for. I really didn't like Larry at first and thought he was a total creep and felt frustrated when Dee falls for his dubious charms. Dee blossoms thanks to her marriage to Larry and having three children – though not in a very good way. She becomes quite harsh and abrasive and I really didn't like her. I missed shy, sweet naïve Dee. The final

quarter of the novel is packed with events shocked me so much my jaw literally smashed into the floor. Dee is a brilliant example of an unreliable narrator and I never saw what happens coming. I'm still stunned by the turn of events. This was a different sort of thriller than I'm used to and I'd describe it more as domestic noir. Dee is a fantastic narrator. I'd highly recommend The Optician's Wife. It's head and shoulders above the competition.

Having read The Quiet Ones not so long ago by the same author, I knew I would be in for a disturbing but enjoyable read and I wasn't wrong. Deborah is one of those quiet mousy types of girl that you would probably forget as soon as you met her. When Larry meets her, it isn't long before he takes her under his wing and turns her into his own creation. I really liked Deborah to start with but have to admit as the story goes on she becomes quite hardened and even though I felt quite sorry for her at times, I didn't really like the person that she was becoming. Larry right from the start I didn't trust. I didn't like how he was moulding Deborah and cutting her off from the outside world and becoming his own personally skivvy. He obviously has his own ideas to how a wife should act and he expects Deborah to follow that to the letter. He is very protective of her and in his own way I do think he truly loves her, though why she loves him so much beats me. It is slightly hard to say much more about the storyline without giving key parts of it away which would spoil it for other readers and I certainly wouldn't want to spoil the surprises that are awaiting them. The Optician's Wife is a dark and disturbing read. The author cleverly reels you in and has you believing what she wants you to believe before grabbing you and twisting you around leaving you dizzy. All I will say is that this is one book that sent a shiver down my spine and had me feeling like someone had walked over my grave! This was a surprisingly decent story. I honestly didn't have high hopes going in and I figured everything out very quickly...but it still kept my interest and had me clicking through the pages rapidly. Recommended!

Larry is all she could wish for as her life is dull, lacking in love and adventure. She marries Larry and she changes from a gauche girl into a woman with lots to live for. Her transformation is gradual and not without knocks to her confidence along the way. Larry is a huge influence on her and she is happy to be led by him. She leaves behind a father who only cares where his next drink comes from, a younger sister who is spoiled, and co-workers in a dead end job. In their local area around Cambridge random killings are taking place with the distinction that the killer removes the victims eyes. As Larry is an Optician we can be forgiven for jumping to conclusions, or maybe not. Deborah and Larry go on to have 3 children and life appears to be going well. Larry seems to have enough money for them to manage but when an opportunity comes along for Deborah to earn extra money, it is too good to turn down. How she earns the money, thinking it acceptable, is surprising in the extreme. I don't want to spoil this brilliant plot but suffice to say it will shock you, up to and including the last 2 pages.
